The government of the Kingdom of Bahrain has announced revised International arrival procedures w.e.f. 27 April 2021 for passengers above the age of 6 arriving from, or transiting through India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh. All passengers arriving from India must carry negative RT-PCR test report with a QR code conducted within 48 hours before departure. All other existing travel-related procedures remain unchanged i.e. all returnees and visitors must undergo PCR testing upon arrival, and test again on their 5th and 10th day, activate the 'BeAware Bahrain' application and sign a self-isolation agreement, which requires passengers to quarantine at their place of residence until their arrival test results are available.

It has come to the notice of the Embassy of India that several Indian passengers arriving in Bahrain are facing problems because of their RT-PCR test reports as the QR code on the test reports are either missing or are not scannable and in some cases the reports generated by QR code do not match with the physical reports, causing avoidable inconvenience to the Indian nationals.

In order to avoid unnecessary inconvenience to the Indian passengers arriving at Bahrain International Airport, it is advised that all passengers coming from India must carry RT-PCR negative test reports with valid QR code and they should invariably verify the QR code by scanning the same before undertaking their travel to Bahrain.
