The Embassy of India organised the Open House in virtual mode on 31 December 2021 between 10:00 hrs to 12:00 hrs, during which Ambassador Piyush Srivastava directly interacted with the members of Indian community for redressing their urgent/non-routine consular and labour issues.

Ambassador urged the Community member to follow up the Covid-19 safety measures and protocols as the Government of Bahrain has adopted the yellow alert level.

Ambassador expressed satisfaction at successful functioning of the IVS Centre at new location at Dana Mall as well as EoIBhCONNECT App, and sought feedback from community members, if any.

Ambassador also informed about the recent decision of Government of Bahrain to allow Bahrain Post offices to process for Resident Permit stickers for Expat Community. More information on this, will shortly be shared on our Social Media Handles.

Ambassador expressed his gratitude to the local government authorities including Labour Market Regularity Authority (LMRA) and

Immigration authorities, as well as appreciation to Indian associations particularly ICRF, World NRI council and Budaiya Gurudwara for support and assistance in resolving a number of issues concerning our community members.
