The facts speak for themselves in the case of the Kingdom of Bahrain.

Bilateral trade was USD 1.72 billion last year and was almost evenly balanced. This year, I expect this number to rise.

Indian investment into Bahrain increased by more than 44 percent since August 2019 after the successful state visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and now stands at around USD 1.6 billion.

In 2023, one million Indian tourists visited Bahrain.

I look forward to further strengthened cooperation and I request both SBI and BIS to be active partners in this important process.
